Him Jyotians win the Runners-up trophy at Woodstock School

Amidst much excitement and anticipation, the Him Jyoti soccer team participated in the Indoor Football Tournament on 11th September 2017. Held at the Woodstock School, the tournament was a first for Him Jyoti wherein they had the unique experience of playing on the wooden floor. A total of ten teams participated, some of which were Kasiga School, Mussoorie Public School, Wynberg Allen School, Hopetown School, Oak Grove School and Woodstock School.

The Him Jyoti team stole the show by 2-1 in its first match against Mussoorie Public School. Continuing its victory, the team qualified for semi finals by a wonderful 3-0 against Hopetown School. Proving its mettle again, the Him Jyoti team won the semi final after defeating Wynberg Allen School by 4-0.

In the much anticipated final match, the Him Jyoti team lost to the Woodstock School team. It was a moment of pride for the Him Jyoti girls when they raised their Runners-up trophy at the end of the tournament. Their endeavor to stand up to some of the finest teams in the sport truly reflects incredible prowess, amazing temperament and fantastic team spirit.

District Junior Volleyball Tournament

On 7th and 8th October 2017, the volleyball teams of the Him Jyoti School went to Tula's International School for the District Junior Volleyball Championship. Both the teams of Him Jyoti exhibited sheer talent during the matches against various schools. On 7th October, Team A played their semi-final match against KVS and bagged a soaring victory. The final match on the following day was played against the Parade Ground Girls team. The Him Jyoti girls put up a great show as they won the Runners up Trophy and Himanshi Rana of Him Jyoti School was awarded the Best Player Trophy.

District Sports

On 3rd and 4th November 2017, the school athletic team took part in the 71st Annual District Athletic Meet 2017 held at RIMC, Dehradun. There were field as well as track events. Kanchan Negi of "Under-18" category was awarded "The Best Athlete" trophy along with the "Under-18 Championship trophy". Him Jyoti School once again bagged the "Best March past" trophy. It came back victorious, with 31 medals in various athletic events. The zest and enthusiasm of each athlete in the field was indeed remarkable. Their endeavour resulted in bringing laurels to the school.

CBSE Sahodaya Volleyball Tournament

On 6th and 7th November 2017, the Volleyball team of Him Jyoti School visited the Horizon School for Inter–School Volleyball Tournament. On the first day, the team played against LGA and DAV Public School. In both the matches, Him Jyoti School won and made it to the finals. On the second day, Him Jyoti team played against DSB with renewed vigor. Him Jyoti won the final match and brought back the trophy for the third time in a row, making it permanent trophy to adorn the portals of the school.

District Khel Mahakumbh Uttarakhand 2017

On 29th November 2017, four football players of Him Jyoti School went to Pavilion Ground, Dehradun for the District Football Match and selection in the State Football Team. They played against Vikasnagar and Doiwala blocks and won by 2-0 in both the matches. Through their true exhibition of sportsman spirit, Him Jyoti girls qualified for the state level.

Doon Cup

From 29th March to 1st April, the Football Team of Him Jyoti School went to Ecole Globale School for the ‘Doon Cup’. The mission of Doon Cup was to bring equality, to make new friends and to prepare the girls for 2027, FIFA WORLD CUP, and also to select players for DANA Cup, which will be held in Denmark. Total 15 schools, clubs and academies participated in the Doon Cup. On both the first and the second days, Him Jyoti School played 6 matches , out of which it won five matches and entered the semifinals . Him Jyoti School emerged as the second Runner Up after defeating Vasant Vihar School ,Delhi by 1-0. It was indeed a tough competition and a great learning experience for all the participants. EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

‘Naya Bharat’ at ONGC

On 1st September 2017, the students of classes XI and XII visited ONGC, Dehradun, for the cultural exhibition entitled “Naya Bharat“. The exhibition elaborately displayed the initiatives taken by our Prime Minister, Mr. Narendra Modi, towards creating a new and empowered India. Some of the themes exhibited were Beti Bachao - Beti Padao, Digital India and Goods and Services Tax. The exhibition was accompanied by a short

programme, which comprised of a magic show and a dance performance, in the Community Hall. The entire visit was a great learning experience for Him Jyoti girls.

Apart from these, there was also a mesmerising magic show and an exhibition based on “Swachh Bharat Abhiyan”, „Digital India“ and Modi’s ideology of making a cleaner India.

Learning Social Responsibility at Mayakund Slum, Rishikesh

On 9th October 2017, a few students of the Him Jyoti School visited the Mayakund slum area at Rishikesh to participate in service activities organized by Seva Child India. The 2nd Annual Mayakund Health Camp conducted a drawing competition for the younger kids living in the slum. In addition to this, students of the Nirmal Ashram, Rishikesh performed a puppet show on Ganga- the river. The Him Jyoti School also performed a street play based on health and hygiene. This was combined with the distribution of Vitamin A to all the children below the age of five. At lunch hour, the Him Jyoti girls were seen ardently helping in distributing food and spreading smiles.

Inter-School Quiz Competition

On 2nd December 2017, the quiz team of the school consisting of 4 students went to Uttaranchal University for the quiz. It was based on a wide range of subjects such as Geography, History, Current Affairs to name a few. Him Jyoti team managed to clear the preliminary round and did fairly well in the stage round also.
