

Our Chief Guest Justice Shri R.C. Lahoti

ur distinguished Chief Guest of the day, Justice Shri R C Lahoti, former Chief Justice of India, was the 35th Chief Justice of India, serving from June 1, 2004 to November 1, 2005.

He is a person of great eminence and intellect, a noted jurist, who is known to have delivered many landmark decisions and took controversial stand on issues while holding the supreme office.

A renowned personality in the legal fraternity, Justice R.C. Lahoti has a rich experience of over 40 years in the field of law and justice. He was born on 1st November 1940. A graduate in law and commerce, he started his court career at Guna in Madhya Pradesh. He was appointed an additional judge of the Madhya Pradesh High Court in 1988, becoming the permanent judge the following year. In 1994, Justice Lahoti was transferred to the Delhi High Court, and was elevated to the Supreme Court in February 1998.

Justice Lahoti, is known to be economic with words but from the verdicts he pronounced, he came across as an independent thinker to whom the application of law was uppermost. In his own words, he believes that Dispensation of Justice is an attribute of God.

Since 2013, Justice Lahoti has been serving as the Chairman of National Committee for Promotion of Social and Economic Welfare, appointed by Government of India. Justice Lahoti has immense interest in legal aid services and Alternate Dispute Resolution Systems and Human Rights awareness programmes.

He has been keenly interested in educational reforms and propagating Indian cultural values and traditions. Justice Lahoti is the Founder Member of Rotary Club of Guna, and remained an active Rotarian for 21 years.

We, at Him Jyoti, are fortunate to have him amongst us on this day as his presence is going to inspire the girls towards greater achievements.







Message from the Founder and Mentor **Shri Sudarshan Agarwal** Former Governor, Uttarakhand and Sikkim.

e are celebrating the completion of 10 years of the growth of the Him Jyoti School. I look back to the day when we started the school with 19 girls in a rented building with bunker beds due to paucity of space. We have come a long way since then – all due to the untiring contribution of the teachers and the successive principals. Today we have a ten acre campus with a beautiful school building, sports grounds, hostel, an infirmary, teachers' quarters, principal's residence and a guest house.

I sincerely commend the pioneering efforts of our first principal Ms. Sangeeta Agrawal in giving shape to our dream of a free Boarding School for bright girls from underprivileged families. The School has come a long way since then. We have 273 girls in the school with 52 girls in different colleges including 5 girls in the prestigious Lady Shriram College and two girls in the Asian University for Women in Bangladesh. Another batch of 32 girls is appearing for the class XII examination. These girls will also join colleges this year. I recall when President Kalam asked the girls in 2006 at Raj Bhawan what they wanted to do in life, one girl stepped out and said, Sir, I wish to be a Governor in a State".

I may not be alive to see that day, but surely, one day, a girl from Him Jyoti could legitimately aspire for a high office. All that these girls lack is an opportunity to unravel their full potential. It is for the civil society and for each one of us to fulfill our social and moral obligation and offer them an opportunity to receive the gift of value based quality education.

I express my gratitude to the corporate houses, a large number of my friends and well wishers and my family who are contributing year after year to keep the Him Jyoti dream alive. My grateful thanks to Shri K N Memani, President, Himalayan School Society for his exceptionally able leadership and to all the office bearers- Shri Rakesh Oberai and Shri Prem Bhalla, Governing Board members, principal Jyoti Dhawan and staff (teaching and non teaching) for their valuable contribution in the vibrant running of the school.



Him Jyoti Boarding School & Vocational Training Institute for under privileged girls at Dehradun.

While serving as Governor in Uttarakhand Shri Sudarshan Agarwal set up a Boarding School for bright girls from impoverished families of Uttarakhand which is totally free for these girls for their education, food, uniforms, toiletries, hostel stay and all other needs. It costs Rs.60,000/- per year to see each girl through the Boarding School. The School, Hostel building and eight flats for teachers, covering 80,000 sq. ft. are built on a ten acre plot of land. It is amongst the finest school buildings in the schooling capital of the country. This bold experiment – a free boarding school – is supported by compassionate, caring and socially sensitive individuals & Corporates by contributions to the corpus and also by adopting girls till they finish their schooling under the 10+2 CBSE curriculum. Currently there are 273 girls in classes V to XII in a school designed for 280 girls (35 in each of the 8 classes).

Him Jyoti School is not just a school but a training ground for life. The girls handpicked from disadvantaged families from each District of Uttarakhand, based on a competitive entrance examination are getting an opportunity to learn the foremost values of love, trust and truth. Him Jyoti's vision is to nurture the learners to be pluralistic, creative, interdependent and capable citizens with a global outlook.

It is pertinent to note that these girls are daughters of a dhobi, an ayah, a tailor, a driver, a farm labourer, a book binder, a rickshaw puller, a school teacher, an office peon and the like. We are confident that they will grow up to make a difference not only in their own lives and the lives of their families and their villages, but will serve the state and the nation in positions of responsibility.

52 girls have passed out in 3 years after completing their 10 + 2 in the school. These girls have got admission in prestigious colleges in North India. 5 girls are studying at Delhi's Lady Shriram College, 2 in I P College, 16 girls in Govt. Colleges for girls at Chandigarh besides girls in Engineering Colleges, Dental College, B.ed colleges and others. Two girls are in their final year in Asian University for Women, Chittagong (Bangladesh). A batch of 29 girls will pass out from the school this year

We spend nearly Rs.1.75 crores each year on the education of girls in the free boarding school and those in colleges.

One of the school girls – Vineeta Pandey – daughter of a daily wage earner has topped in a Leadership Award Programme beating boys and girls from The Doon School, Welham Girls' School, Dehradun, Vasant Valley School and Shriram School, Delhi. She has been to Brown University; an Ivy League University in USA for a 10 day summer camp.

Three girls and a teacher have been to Victoria College in Belfast, Ireland in September 2012 on an exchange visit. Last year, girls from that school spent two weeks at Him Jyoti School under an exchange program supported by the British Council.

The Society have now embarked on a new project for girls from Uttarakhand. On March 2014, they held the ground breaking ceremony of a new building to set up a Vocational Training Institute for 200 girls from economically weaker sections of society. A philanthropist friend from Delhi, Shri Anil Chanana has contributed Rs. Three crores to set up this Institute. The founder Shri Sudarshan Agarwal and his family are contributing Rs. fifty lakhs for this Institute. The Institute shall have five different vocational courses for these girls so that after their two year study, they are able to make a decent living for themselves and their families.

E&Y is contributing Rs.15 lakhs each year on the education of 30 girls studying in colleges. The Memani family are contributing Rs.21 lakhs each year on the education of 35 girls (one class).

The Society propose to start the courses in the academic year starting in 2015. They are constructing a beautiful building on a 1.25 acre piece of land across the road from the Him Jyoti school building. With support from friends like you, they shall be able to make a difference in the lives of young girls who are not as fortunate as our own children.





इसीलिए --


जीवन के क्षेत्र में वहीं लोग विजयी होते हैं, जो अपनी जीत के प्रति आशान्वित होते हैं।



recognized by the singular success of the School, the screety will now establish a Vocational Training institute, whereby select girls from economically weaker sections of society will get the opportunity to learn unarounal skills – training that will directly lead to employment, careers and thus, empowerment.

The Institute will begin with 100 girls - five courses with 20 trainees each, for a two year programme, beginning April 2015. This will be a world class vocational training facility that will enable young women in Uttarakhand to takea crucial step forward in their lives.

The project will be supported by the Socially Conscious Individuals & Public and Private sector Companies.

The Bhumi Poojan of what will be the Institute was conducted in March 2014, and the project flagged off by a commitment of Rupees three crore by Shri Anil Chanana, and Rupees fifty lakh by Smt and Shri Sudarshan Agarwal.

On March 4, 2014 we performed the Bhumi Pujan of a new building to set up the Vocational Training Institute for 200 girls from economically weaker sections of society. We shall have five different vocational courses for these girls so that after their two year study, they are able to make a decent living for themselves and their families. The courses are:

- Apparel Sector (Fashion Technology/ Dress Making)-a years duration.
- Architecture Draughtsman ship-2 years duration.
- Computer Operator & Programming-1/2year's duration.
- Hotel Management-2 year's duration.
- Travel & Tour assistant-1/2year's duration.

We propose to start the courses in the academic year starting in July/August 2015. We have planned a beautiful building on a 1.25 acre piece of land across the road from the Him Jyoti school building. With support from friends like you, we shall be able to make a difference in the lives of young girls who are not as fortunate as our own children.

Vocational education programs have made a real difference in the lives of countless young people nationwide; they build self-confidence and leadership skills by allowing students to utilize their unique gifts and talents."
