### Wildlife Week Celebration

On the 2nd of October 2022, the Wildlife Preservation Society inaugurated Wildlife Week at Him Jyoti School.



Workshop on Nest Making

"Let us save our sparrows' habitat before it's too late."

A workshop on 'Nest Making' was hosted by Him Jyoti School, on 2nd October 2022. It was conducted by Mr. Rakesh Khatri, an environmentalist, and Founder of the Eco Roots Foundation, which works tirelessly to conserve the ecosystem and bio-diversity of the environment.

The workshop started with showing a video on saving birds. Next, Mr. Rakesh Khatri was invited to interact with the students and teach them the process of nest-making. He explained the habitation system of birds, the food birds eat, the medicinal value of turmeric to heal an injured bird, using ice cream sticks to feed birds, and various ways to help the survival of home sparrows. He exhibited various kinds of nests made from

waste material, tetra packs, and organic material.

Mr. Khatri also demonstrated the step-by-step process of nest-making using materials such as plastic jars, pencils, cloth, jute, rope, wool, paper cuttings, dry leaves, etc.




## Workshop by Ashoka University


## · Reliance Football Championship
