We are proud to share that Him Jyoti School has once again achieved a 100% pass result in the CBSE, Class 10 and Class 12 Board Examinations for the academic year 2024–25.

Our Class 12 topper scored an outstanding 97.2%, and many students across both classes secured above 90%, a testament to their perseverance and the unwavering commitment of our teachers.

Jazz for Kids at Welham Girls' School

Promoting Wellness: Ayushman Camp



An 'Ayushman Camp' was held at Him Jyoti School by the State Health Authority. During the camp, Ayushman Cards and ABHA (Ayushman Bharat Health Account) IDs were generated for all students. The initiative connects students to the national health network, enabling access to essential health services and benefits.

Nature Walk at The Doon School



Eight students from Him Jyoti School participated in a nature walk organised by NEST and The Doon School Nature Club. The walk highlighted native and exotic tree species such as Silver Oak, Sagoon, and Dua Banga, along with biodiversity-supporting flowering plants. Students also learned about the Hornbill, a keystone species important for seed dispersal, and engaged in discussions on conservation with environmental educators.





Visit to Himalayan Farms



A group of 68 students from Class 9 and 11 visited Himalayan Farms for an educational trip filled with learning and inspiration.



They explored modern farming methods like hydroponics, aeroponics, and tissue culture, and visited the herbal garden, laboratories, and a fascinating museum showcasing the evolution of agriculture.

UNFOLD Inter-school STEM Competition



On 22nd April 2025, five students from Grades 10 to 12 represented Him Jyoti School at the UNFOLD Inter-school STEM Competition hosted by Unison World School.

In Orbital 1, they built a hydraulicpowered robot and tied in a thrilling round with Welham Girls' School. In Orbital 2, they designed a zipline propeller racer and advanced to the final round among 12 participating schools.


Youth 4 Himalaya Workshop at Welham Girls' School
